A person is an Amateur for the purpose of classes run under Association Rules if he/she does not, during the current or previous season:

• Engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing, or hiring horses in a commercial capacity, or as means of deriving a source of income

- Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in racing, showing, livery stable or
- riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This does not include the suppliers of ancillary services such as farriers and vets.

 Own/Part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to; riding schools, events centre, stud, or livery yard in any capacity, or receive
- any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment
- Show a Horse owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm, or act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, SHB(GB) or otherwise, or a Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned PLEASE NOTE:
- a), If you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board/Council, i.e., if you ride/compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be deemed professional
- b). A competitor is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in ANY class, SHB(GB) or otherwise, with the exception of Working classes, Side Saddle classes AND Novice classes, during the current year and the following year, up to but not including the Royal International Horse Show.
- c). (The above Rule (b) does not apply, if the Horse has been Professionally Produced and ONLY ridden by a Professional, during the current season,
- or if the horse has subsequently been sold and re-registered under new Ownership).
 d). On the day when an Exhibit is competing in Amateur classes, Professionals, including Professional Grooms, are not allowed to ride, to work-in (in
- any form), compete, or enter the Ring to groom/strip the Horse.
- e). No commercial branding can be visible in the ring, during Amateur classes (including Amateur Home Produced), this applies to equines, riders and any attendees; this also includes outside the ring, or onlinei.e. on social media.
- f). We may require a statement of your eligibility to compete in Home Produced classes.
- 1. AMATEUR CLASSES
- a). AMATEUR OWNER / RIDER: Open to Horses owned and ridden by an Amateur. No Professional, including Professional Grooms, are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse
- b). AMATEUR HOME PRODUCED: Open to Horses, which are either stabled at home or in a D. I. Y. yard and which since 1st January in the current year, have not been shown by a Professional during the current season or stabled in a Professional yard at any time in the current year. To be ridden by an Amateur. This does not exclude Amateur Owner Home Produced riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. No Professional, including Professional Grooms, are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse. We may require a statement of your eligibility to compete in Home

Produced classes.classes.Working Hunters—Grade A Showjumpers and Advanced Event Horses are not eligible to enter. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1 January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter Classes. The maximum total points available is 100. This is made up of: Jumping points = Max 40 points, Style & Presence whilst Jumping = Max 20 points, Ride/Manners = Max 20 points, Conformation = Max 20 points. Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged. The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack is allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only).

NOVICE WORKING HUNTER. A mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over not to have won a first prize of £25 or a total of £150 (or equivalent values) in prize money (including championship prize money) in any SHB(GB) affiliated Working Hunter Class, or more than 5 BE points or 200 BS points, at home or equivalent abroad before 1st January in the relevant year. Fences in Novice Working Hunter classes should have a minimum height of 0.85m (2'9") and a maximum height of 1.00m (3'3"). Working Hunters may compete 'Hors Concours' in Novice Working Hunter classes in the jumping phase only at the discretion of the show secretary but the horse cannot compete in any other Working Hunter classes for the duration of that show. Any horse that qualifies for Horse of the Year Show or Royal International Horse Show will not be eligible to compete in Novice classes from 1st January the following year, but horses that qualified for HOYS as a 4 year old are

NOVICE HUNTERS.. Mare or gelding four years old and over, not having won a first prize of £25 or a total of £150 (or equivalent values) in prize money (including championship prize money) in any SHB(GB) affiliated Ridden Hunter Classes at home or abroad, before 1st January in the current year, excepting all prize money awarded as a four year old. 4 year olds will be ridden by a ride judge in these classes. An SHB(GB) special award will be made to the highest placed 4 year old in a Novice class.

RIHS QUALIFYING CLASSES Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners, Exhibitors and Riders and must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.

Classes 62-74 are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.

Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes

The highest placed unqualifed exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of the Year Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA. National Championship Shows in September 2024 The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes).

Recipients of the Young Rider rosette will qualify for the BSHA Young Rider of the Year at the National Championship Show in September 2024.
